BISLEY MEETING, 1929.

The Bisley Meeting this year will be held on Saturday and Sunday the 23rd and 24th inst. The competitions will be as follows :-

King's Prize. Open to all members of the Rifle Association.
Entrance Fee 3/-.
1st Stage. Seven shots and one sighter at 200, 500 & 600 yards. 50% pass into
2nd Stage. Seven shots and one sighter at 300, 500 & 600 yards. The highest twelve pass into
3rd Stage. Ten shots and one sighter at 900 & 1,000 yards.

Recruit's Match. Open to all 1923-29 recruits of the Defence Force who are also members of the Rifle Association.
Entrance Fee 1/-, seven shots and one sighter at 200 yards.

Open 500 & 600 yds. Open to all members of the Rifle Association.
Entrance Fee 2/6. Seven shots and one sighter at 500 & 600 yards.

Team Shoot. Open to teams of four members. Entrance fee 10/- per team. Seven shots and one sighter per man at 200, 500 & 600 yards.

Open Handicap. Open to all members of the Rifle Association.
Entrance Fee 2/6. Seven shots and one sighter at 200, 500 and 600 yards. Competitors will be handicapped by the Committee according to their average score during the present season.

Bishop's Trophy. Open to all members of the Rifle Association.
Entrance Fee 2/6. Seven shots and one sighter at 900 and 1,000 yards.

In every competition one sighting shot will be given. Additional sighters may be purchased at the rate of 6d each before shooting commences and may be used when required. No more than two sighters will be allowed at each range.

Entry forms are obtainable from any member of the Committee. All entries must be handed in to any member of the Committee before 4 p.m. on Tuesday 19th inst. No entry will be held to have been made until full payment of the entrance fee has been made.

Scores will be kept on cards, competitors will receive instructions as/

as to the use of these cards on the range.

Competitors must supply their own refreshments on both days but tea will be served on Sunday afternoon the 24th.

A dance will be held in the Town Hall on Monday 25th., admission Gentlemen 5/-. Ladies free.

Sweepstake tickets are obtainable at 2/6 each on the King's Prize, this sweep will be drawn in May.
