Owing to having to supply Capt Smith with two kitson lamps for work in connection with the discharging of Admiralty coal, the lamp in question has had to be removed. There are 18 lamp posts in the Town of which only 14 can be used owing to 5 lamps being used for other purposes, viz:-

- 2 for Capt Smith
- 2 for lighting Town Hall
- 1 in Printing Office

No complaint has been received in this Office in connection with this question.

The best way to light this particular spot is to remove lamp to corner of road and erect another lamp in James Street. There is one lamp very rarely used at top of hill leading to Sullivan House and could be removed with advantage to James St. Further I would suggest that for next year's estimates, four or six new lamps (full outfit) be provided.


