Reporting interference with street lamps.

The Hon, Col. Secy.,

I beg to submit the following report in reference to interference, by some person or persons unknown, with the street lamps.

2. Mr G. Perry (Lamplighter) reports that on the night of the 15th. inst. at about 10-30 p.m. he extinguished the light at Waverley House. Constable Hooley informed Perry the following morning that this lamp was alight at 11-30 the previous evening. The lamp remained alight until again extinguished by Perry on Saturday morning. On examination of the lamp it was found that the lamp glass and glass in lantern door frame were broken. The lamp is being repaired and a new glass supplied. I fear it will be a costly matter to keep this lamp in working order if this ~~interference~~ continues.

3. A few nights ago a 14' ladder attached to one of the Kitson Lamp posts was wrenched from the top carrying bar and thrown on to the adjoining fence. Considerable force was required to effect this damage, fortunately little damage was done to the lamp only the vapouriser being disarranged.
