
In carrying the line across the street, it would be almost horizontal in relation to the run of the road.

Stanley, Falkland Islands.

I beg to attach a letter received from Mr Rowe applying for permission to open up the road on John Street for the purpose of laying a water pipe. He wishes to lay a pipe across the road and concrete path for a private water supply from a tank at the back of the "Globe" Store to Waverley House.

2. I do not feel justified in recommending the request, and I should be glad if the matter could be submitted to His Excellency the Acting Governor.

3. When the Government water main was laid in John Street, at the request of Mr. Rowe a connection with stop cock was laid to the boundary of Waverley House and also connections to boundaries of other properties owned by Estate L. Williams. In M.P. 306/27 an application for water connections to Waverley House was approved and later cancelled by the firm.

I have since endeavoured to persuade the firm to have the water laid on from the town mains, but Mr. Rowe has raised objections. He states that he has a good supply in the tanks which he now wishes to utilise.
