The boiler is a Blake with wet up-take of about 5' to 6' diameter and would weigh approximately 6 tons. The winch is an ordinary horizontal type with warping ends and quick whipping drums. 

3. Mr. Neave has accordingly been requested to prepare a modified scheme for the improvement of the sanitary conditions of Stanley on the understanding that, for financial reasons, the town must remain dependent on water collected from the roofs of buildings and that the earth closet system must be retained.

2. I do not think that a proposal in any form that the supply should come from the surface trainage of the common is acceptable, except as a last resort, for obvicus reasons.

3. In despatch No. 15 of the 25th of February, 1846, Governor Moody reported that he had caused two wells to be dug to replace a costly scheme for piping water from springs. In the first, after digging down 16 feet through clay of various consistencies a volume of water was found; a second well was dug with success through stony clay, clay slate and quartz rock to a depth of 20 feet. These wells have since been filled up, as have wells in other countries and for the same reasons. If however any considerable supply can be obtained by boring, the water being pumped up by windmill, such as are

4. I have drawn Mr. Neave's attention to the proposition. He has been handicapped by the absence of records of any borings and by not having any boring plant. He wishes to investigate the possibilities, for the water should be pure. A further report will be made in due course.

5. It is proper to state that the absence of any proper index to early despatches from the Colony has precluded an earlier reference to Governor Moody's despatch, to which I have referred.



With reference to my despatch No. 87 of the 5th of July, 1923, on the subject of the provision of a water supply for the town of Stanley, I have the honour to attach a further report from Mr. Neave relative to boring experiments which he has undertaken.

2. I have watched the experiments from their initiation with Mr. Neave. On the 9th of November he recommended as a result of the success of trial borings with primitive hand plant, that further material to the value of SA38 should be purchased. Of this amount 2107 was required for boring operations, the balance being for a portable oil engine and piping, required in any event for the Stanley improvement scheme. I received Mr. Neave's assurance that the hospital, Government House and the public reservoir could, as far as it was possible to foresee, be kept supplied with good water.

3. Mr. Neave was anxious to proceed with the work without delay as he will be returning, to the United Kingdom this year. I therefore authorized, with the full concurrence of the Executive/



In reply to your letter of 21st November concerning the sinking of wells at Port Stanley, Falkland Islands, whilst I willingly say what I can, I do so with a sense that I am really not competent to express an opinion of any high value on such a matter. I can, however, draw attention to certain points.

"Wood View"

The quartzite rock around Port Stanley is very hard, and I suppose that the sinking of wells into or through it would be a lengthy and expensive business. It is an impervious rock, but is fortunately jointed, so that water could soak down through these joints to the region of saturation below. I do not think the latter would be found to lie at any great depth as there are springs in the vicinity of Stanley. On the other hand there would be the risk of contamina-There are already a number of ? shallow surface tion. wells in Stanley but these are not used, I believe, and I was told that they were shut down by order of a former Governor in consequence of their becoming contaminated. There is also, of course, the risk of sea-water getting into the rocks. If however sea-water were absent and there was no pollution from the surface I should think the water found would prove to be of excellent quality. It might possibly be somewhat ferruginous. It is very difficult to form a notion of the underground storage capacity of the strata around Port Stanley owing to the geological structure. The

rocks

•

rocks are arranged in the form of long, narrow troughs, lying practically due east and west. Stanley Harbour lies in such a trough and apparently about in the centre of it. If I had to sink a well I think I would look for a site due west of Stanley Harbour, so as to keep in the trough. I should go westward of the big wireless station and try to find a spot within the trough sufficiently elevated that the bottom of a hole say 50 or 60 feet deep would still be above the level of the water in Stanley Harbour.

If it were proposed to construct a pumpoperated tube-well, of about 3 inches diameter, possibly the cost of this would not be too formidable, and in the event of its being a success others could be put down afterwards.

Has the possibility of constructing a larger spring-fed reservoir been considered?

I trust these observations will prove helpful. I wish I could be more useful.



Report on Possibility of Jater Supply from Artesian Jolls.

Sir,

With reference to my submittion dated 31st December, 1923., on the above subject I ben to report that I have not made further investigations into the question of the possibility of obtaining a suitable fater supply for the term from subterranean sources but the recults obtained are disappointing, and I do not recommend that this source of supply be adopted.

In my Preliminary Scient, paragraphs 11 and 12, dated February, 1923., I expressed the opinion, "This geological "formation is not such as would lead to the expectation "of the existence of a rood underground supply", and a surface eatchment scheme for house to house supply at the rate of 50 gallons per head per diem one put forward at an estimated cost of 54,000. This was ruled out however on financial grounds as being beyond the means of the deleng.

Subsequently various other possibilities were considered with a view to evolving if possible a less comprehensive scheme based on a much lower allowance of water per head per diem, and it was decided to investigate the question of the possibility of obtaining a moderate supply from a series of wells and pumps connected to a service reservoir, it being on record that wells were such in the early days of the settlement.

There is very little data available as regards the local geological formation as there are no mines, railway outtings, tunnels, deep excavations or deep wells in existence, but the formation is known to be very highly contorted and folded. Under these circumstances investigatory work is difficult and uncertain, but at the same time this uncertainty leaves open the possibility of finding a bed of mater bearing strata (vide paragraph 12 of my Preliminary Report above quoted), success in which latter might provide the required mater supply at a relatively low cost.

A shaft such to a depth of 18 feet on the East side of Sapper's Hill near No: 2 bore site showed considerable promise in its early stages as a bed of soft sandstone water bearing rock with fessils was encountered underlying the surface clay. It was hoped that this might prove to be an appreciable bed of earlier geological age than the prevalent quartite and did it extend to any considerable depth the amount of water would doubtless be serviceable. Unfortunately the formation at this site proved to be in the mature of a complete "overfold", and, after excavating through about 10 feet of soft sandstone, peaty matter and the hard grey quartite was again encountered with a comparatively shall amount of running sand and water.

No: 1 bore has been enlarged and a "" drive tube put deam 18 feet with 5" lining tube to a depth of 50 feet below surface (perforated for the lower 7 feet of its length) but at 55 feet depth the tools are in hard quartaite. Hinor pumping tests have been carried out and probably about 200 gallons per day could be obtained from each of these sites (i.e. a total of about 400 gallons per diem).

The results are disappointing because the rater obtained is apparently a very good quality mater being maturally filtered through running sand and cut off from the surface by impervious clays, but only pumping over an extended period could prove shether the arounts stated would be available at all seasons.

The supply would doubtless be of service to a small settlement but for a town the size of Stanley I do not consider a satisfactory supply can be provided from this source and I an accordingly putting forward on separate papers a modified scheme for a supply from the file Pond, as foreshadowed in my submission dated 27th June, 1928.



<u>Stanley Improvement Scheme</u>. Report on Possibility of Water Supply from Artesian Wells.

Sir,

Further to my submission, dated 25th April, 1924, on the above subject, I beg to report that I do not advise proceeding any further with boring investigations in view of the results recorded and data collected during the summer 1923 - 1924, when I devoted a very considerable emount of time to this matter.

The primary object of boring experiments was to ascertain whether considerable beds of porous sandstone or running sands existed in the neighbourhood of Stanley, as from the existence of such strata a good water supply might be expected. My investigations have, however, confirmed my opinion that although porous sandstone (and running sands) undoubtedly exist, yet they are not of sufficient extent to provide anything like sufficient water for the Town. The bulk of the strata in the neighbourhood is a hard metamorphic sandstone which cannot be regarded as a promising source of supply.

The extent of the work was limited to a considerable extent by the fact that the power plant requested in my submission of 19th October, 1923, was not available for working until towards the end of February, 1924, when the Falkland summer was practically over, and was severe) handicapped by the lack of men with any experience of boring operations.

As stated at the time of commencing investi ions as to the possibility of a supply from subterra The Honourable the Colonial Secretary. Sour sources, such investigations in this Colony could only be regarded as experimental and no guarantee as to results could be given. The possibility of success, however, justified the undertaking of such work, as the discovery of such subterranean water would have allowed the provision of a cheap water supply, a very important factor having regard to local conditions.

Whilst I am naturally disappointed that sufficient water has not been discovered to be of practical utility, I do not regard the time or provision of boring tools as misspent, as it is often only by undertaking experimental work that progress can be made. I do not consider, however, that a suitable supply can be provided from subterranean sources, and if Stanley is to have a water supply, I recommend the adoption of one of the surface schemes put forward on separate papers.

I am directed by the Governor to inform you that the materials purchased by this Government in 1923 under Indent No. 237, your reference No. $\frac{1}{572}$ 1687/3, for boring operations are no longer required and to enquire whether there is any possibility of disposing of them to another Colony or alternatively whether the suppliers would be willing to repurchase them.

2. A large part of the materials were never used the remainder were used for a few weeks only. The Colonial Engineer reports that the used material is equal to new. I attach a statement distinguishing the former from the latter.

3. We do not know at present of any other likely source of disposal in this country for the plant, and shall be glad to hear whether you will entertain the firm's offer.


