At a special meeting of all Church people held 25th June 1946 it was unanimously agreed that the Cathedral should erect a suitable Memorial to those who gave their lives in the cause of Justice and Freedom in the recent terrible war.

It was agreed that the memorial should be something useful to the life of prayer and worship of the Church. These suggestions were put to the meeting:-

- (1) A new organ. The present instrument is very old and in a poor state of repair. A pipe organ of adequate size would cost at least £1,500; a "Hammond" electric instrument would have cost about £400 in 1939, but we are not at present certain whether it would operate successfully on our electricity supply and enquiries are being made.
- (2) A Chapel attached to the main structure of the Cathedral This would be used for week-day services, Communicants Guild services, Confirmation Classes and so on. The Executive Engineer has kindly drawn some plans, and he would suggest using the existing Vestry as a Chapel, and building a new Vestry on the south side; this would avoid any alteration to the lines of the Cathedral on the north.
 - (3) The completion of all or part of the plans initiated by Dean Stanley Smith



Falkland Islands Labour Federation.

Address by Mr. W. J. McAtasney to a General Meeting upon taking office as Chairman on February, 11th., 1946 and broadcast over the local system on February, 24th., 1946.

Gentlemen.

You have asked me to be your Chairman and I am willing to try it on condition you accept my views as to how the Federation should function, its duties and liabilities, the power it can be for good or evil and the influence it will have in the future over all our lives; to be Chairman is an honour I appreciate for the respect of one's fellow Workmen is worth having. The only thing I promise at the moment is to do my best Workmen is worth having. The only thing I to aim at a "Square deal" policy for everybody.

To think back previous to 1933 when no Labour Organization existed and most people scoffed at the idea of there ever being one makes one ask 'Why not'? the reasons are many but the principal one was Jealousy; jealousy and mistrust between Man and Man and between Man and Master; in days gone by being well aware of this failing the Master in many cases took advantage of it and played the middle against both ends, this was aptly summed up by a certain Senior Official some years ago who said, "The Falkland Islander's worst enemy is another Falkland Islander".

This then was the position when the Reform League came into being in 1933, much was accomplished during the following years in spite of all the critics may say who as usual sat on the fence waiting for an opportunity to jump the best paid way, from 1933 until 1944 when the Labour Federation was formed the League functioned as a Labour Organization though really a political one, many of us saw the crying need for a properly organized Union or Federation and after many up and downs and much hard work this Labour Federation was registered as such on the 9th December, 1944 and of course came under the Trade Union and Trade Disputes Ordinance which became Law on March 13th 1942.

So much for conditions previous to the registration of our Federation we started from scratch our only assets being the Will to Succeed and Unlimited Optimism; today our funds total some $\pounds 500$ the membership roll is steadily increasing and I feel confident that every Man in the Colony will one day be a member.

What is a Labour Federation we ask? I cannot do better than relate the following perfectly true anecdote. Some years ago happening to be with an old friend on the day of a Reform League meeting he abruptly asked me did I know what the F. I. R. L. on the flag stood for. My answer was "No". He told me "Freedom, Independence, Right to Live!" — Independence, Freedom, Freedom - blessed word; freedom from want, from poor living, from fear, from interference, from intimidation, in short Freedom from everything that does not make for contentment.




