Funds are not available for this work from the provision made in the estimates under Head XVIII, items 1 and 2. It is thought that the provision under item 1 (£500) will be sufficient for known requirements to the 31st of December.

2. There is at present an unallocated balance of £90 under item 2, Repairs. This sum will hardly be sufficient to cover repair work contemplated to the 31st of December and a S/W will probably be required.

I would suggest, therefore, that the work to be done at Government House be charged to this item.
