
I have the honour to report a case of Enteric Fever at the residence of Mr. Walsh in Philemel Street.

The Gutters and Trenches in the vicinity of this house are in a foul smelling insanitary condition, and require immediate attention. The Colonial Engineer informs me that the very foul smelling trench in front of the infected house is not under his care, but is on private land; surely some action can be taken to compel the owners to clean and disinfect that portion of trench in front of their dwellings; he also informs me that Urinals are allowed to run into the street gutters, this should not be allowed, as the infection in Enteric is carried to a great extent by the urine, to say nothing about its being a most insanitary procedure. The Gutter in Philemel St are of faulty construction and require looking after.
