



Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 108 of the 30th September, 1916, enclosing a copy of a letter from the Admiralty intimating that the Cement referred to in my despatch No. 123 of the 12th July is set aside for the construction of a reservoir for water supply in connexion with the Wireless Telegraph Station, and that the cement will not be available for issue to the Colonial Government.

2. At the time I had the honour to address you in July last, I understood that all works of construction at the Wireless Telegraph Station had been completed, and as I wished to reassure myself on the information then given me I visited the Station yesterday to question Lieut. J. R. Crawford, R.N.V.R., Officer in Charge, and Lieut. A. McLean, R.N.V.R., Senior Marconi Engineer on the subject, and consult them as to the necessity for the construction of a reservoir.

3. I understand that it was originally intended to construct on slightly elevated ground, a large reservoir into which the water could be pumped direct from the river which runs by the side of the Station grounds. A dam has however been built

crossed the river, and a natural reservoir has thus been formed. From this reservoir the water is pumped into large tanks on a higher level for use at the Power House and the Officers quarters. To safeguard <sup>against</sup> failure of supply into these tanks, two pumps have been erected so that in the event of one pump failing at any time the other pump is available for immediate use. The river reservoir has throughout the past year shown no signs of an insufficient supply of water.

4. In the circumstances it appears to me that the construction of the Reservoir contemplated in the first instance, is now no longer necessary, a view that is shared by both Lieut. Crawford and Lieut. McMillan.

5. I may add that Lieut. McMillan informed me yesterday, when I told him I proposed to report the matter to you, for the consideration of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that he was very glad to know that the matter would be further considered, as he had already written to Messrs Hartson and Co. impressing upon them that the construction of the reservoir is no longer necessary.

6. Should the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty be pleased to take the matter into further consideration, and decide to abandon the construction of the proposed reservoir, and sanction the Colonial Government purchasing, from the stock at Navy Point, the amount asked for by my despatch of July last, I

beg that I may be informed by cable, as cement is required by the Colonial Government for works now in hand.

7. In the event of this Government being unable to obtain the cement from the stock at Navy Point I beg that the Crown Agents may be authorised to order and ship to this Colony by first suitable opportunity a supply as asked for in the enclosed indent.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 23rd August, 38375/1916, enclosing a copy of a despatch from the Governor of the Falkland Islands, applying for a supply of Cement now lying at Admiralty stores, I am commanded by My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that the Cement in question is set aside for the construction of a reservoir for water supply in connection with the Wireless Station, the work on the reservoir having been left over until the summer season on account of the danger of the cement work being damaged by frost.

2. My Lords regret, therefore, that the Cement will not be available for issue to the Colonial Government.
