I regret to report that an unfortunate accident occurred this morning on the junction of Ross Road and Villiers Street. - 2. From enquiries made it would appear that no blame attaches to the driver. The girl was travelling at speed and turned the corner close to the kerb on the wrong side of the road. Mr. S.P. Surmers, the driver of the lorry, from his report attached, apparently tried to avoid the accident by swerving the lorry to the off side, but it would appear that the girl was too close. As he says he pulled the lorry up in less than its own length, which shows that he was not travelling at speed.
- 3. Mr. G.L. Challen and the Chief Constable visited the site immediately after the accident and noted the marks of the bicycle and lorry on the road.
 - 4. Miss Hansen was taken immediately to the Hospital.
 - 5. The damaged bicycle is in the Government garage.
